American-International Charolais Association (AICA) Class A Roll of Excellence Show

SPECIAL RULES

All animals to be eligible for an Open Charolais Breeding Class must be purebred and registered with AICA. Only Bona Fide (original) certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership; **NO PHOTOCOPIES.**

An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an open Charolais breeding class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herdbook.

All animals to be eligible may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the sifting committee.

All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads not permitted.

Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.

Bulls from classes 111, 112, 115, 116 and 117 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.

All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow/Calf Class (Class 96) and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2007. Calves at side must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2007, must show in individual female class appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.

All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA-sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.

AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggests that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.

ALL EXHIBITS OF CHAROLAIS BREEDING CATTLE SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE AICA RULES AND REGULATIONS, ARTICLE XV, TITLED EXHIBITION ON ANIMALS. THE INSPECTION OF EXHIBIT CATTLE IS SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH C, OF THE ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS AND NON-COMPLIANCE OF EXHIBIT INSPECTION IS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH D OF THE SAME ARTICLE XV.

ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH B, POINT 2; "Each animal will be presented in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical or other (including banding or other circulatory constriction) appearance change for cosmetic purpose, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."

Effective October 22, 2004, at any American-International Charolais Association (AICA) sanctioned show (including shows receiving AICA premium funding and/or qualifying as a Roll of Excellence Show), the use of a coloring agent, flock and powder is prohibited. Use of these products will result in the immediate disqualification of a given animal at such show.

Where circumstances exit and/or allow, AICA reserves the right to split large individual classes after the check-in procedure is complete.

ALL OTHER RULES OF SHOW APPLY.

PREMIER BREEDER AND PREMIER EXHIBITOR awards will be given on the point system as follows: 3 pts. for first prize, 2 pts. for second prize, 1 pt. for third prize, 3 pts. for Grand Champion, 2 pts. for Reserve Grand Champion. NO points for Divisional Champions or Reserve Champions. Points will be given on eight head only. Group classes included, using the same scoring system.

Tie Breaker: Exhibitor with the most points won by animals bred AND OWNED IN INDIVIDUAL CLASSES.

ENTRY IN THIS SHOW BINDS THE EXHIBITOR TO ALL REGULATIONS PERTAINING THERETO.

Standard Show Classifications Purebred Shorthorns

All cattle must be purebred to be eligible to show.

In order for an exhibitor to be eligible to receive the American Shorthorn Association's (ASA) share of the premiums at ASA supported shows, the owner's entire herd must be enrolled in the Shorthorn Performance Records (SPR) Program and each animal shown must have individual SPR records.

No exhibitor shall be permitted to win more than two prizes in any one class.
All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the ASA by the time of the Fair or show.

Individual animals shown in all of the group classes listed below must have been entered and shown in one of the following classes for single animals. Multiple owned animals must be exhibited in the name of all owners.

Family bred and raised animals entered by juniors in Junior Classes and subsequently entered in Open classes may be treated as family entries in group classes.

All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are subject to a tattoo inspection by representatives of the ASA. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are also subject to an age inspection if deemed necessary by the ASA and the **decision of the examining veterinarian is final.** Use of artificial fins on show animals is not permitted.

IMPORTANT: Each of the following classes **MAY** be broken into multiple classes to accommodate large numbers of entries, but separate classes **MAY NOT** be combined into one. For example, there **MAY** be four “Junior Heifer Calf” classes, but there **MAY NOT** be one single “Spring Heifer Calf” class (combining Late and Early Spring calves).

Entry in this show binds the exhibitor to all regulations pertaining hereto.

Senior/Junior Yearling Pregnancy Rule for exhibitors at all Open Shows: Any senior/junior yearling female 28 months of age or older must have a natural calf at side and must be shown with such. ***All females 20 months of age must have a 60 day pregnancy verification signed by an accredited, non-owner veterinarian at the time the female is processed for the Show.** Exhibitors may be asked to present said verification upon the request of the Show officials. If verification cannot be produced, the female may be allowed to participate if the exhibitor can produce a qualified veterinarian to examine the female at the show site, and verify a 60-day pregnancy.

RULES & REGULATIONS

All animals must be registered in the American Hereford Association or American Polled Hereford Assoc.; original registration certificates must be presented upon request of Show Officials or AHA Staff.

Animals must be entered and exhibited under the recorded ownership name or co-owners' names as of show entry deadline date. Ear tattoos must be legible and correct for show eligibility.

Violation of AHA's rules regarding defects and unethical practices will result in disqualification of animals in question. All other rules of this Show apply.

These rules are specific and clear. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make himself familiar with them. They must be complied with.

GENERAL RULES

- A. **RECORD OF REGISTRY:** Registration in the American Hereford Association is required of all Herefords owned by and to be exhibited by American breeders, whether the animals were domestically produced or of foreign origin. Herefords originating outside the United States and owned by breeders living outside the USA must be registered in the recognized herd or stud book of the country of origin and recognized by the American Hereford Association, or registered in the AHA.
- B. **REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES:** Exhibitors are required to have AHA original registration certificates of the animals on exhibit, in possession of the herdsman with the cattle. Similarly, in cases of animals originating from outside the USA and owned by breeders outside the USA, official registration certificates from country of origin are required. It is required that original registration certificates be current and accurate with regard to the animal's recorded ownership as of the show's entry deadline date. Original registration certificates are to be made available on request to staff.
- C. **REGISTRATION STATUS:** Application for registration must be on file with AHA by that specific show's entry deadline date for an animal to be eligible for that specific show.
- D. **IDENTIFICATION BY TATTOO:** Ear tattoos must be clearly legible and agree with animal's registration certificate. Any animal whose tattoos do not match the registration certificate is ineligible to be exhibited in that show at which detection is made.
- E. **OWNERSHIP:** Cattle must be entered and exhibited under the recorded ownership as of the show's entry deadline date. (See Rule "G" also.)
- F. **NEW OWNERS:** Transfers of ownership must be on file in the AHA office no later than the show's entry deadline date.
- G. **JOINTLY OWNED ANIMALS:** Jointly owned animals must be entered and exhibited under the joint ownership in the individual heifer and bull classes.
- H. **GROUP CLASSES:**
- (1) Jointly owned animals must be shown in the Group Classes by one of the co-owners under his banner, or may be shown in this class under the joint ownership if all animals are owned alike.
 - (2) A common ownership of all four animals in the Get-of-Sire Classes is not required; they may be solely owned or jointly owned by different breeder-exhibitors, but get-of-sire entry may be entered/exhibited in the name of only one herd.
- I. **DEFECTS AND UNETHICAL PRACTICES:** The following are considered defects and unethical practices. Any violation of the rules regarding these will result in disqualification of the animal in question:
- (1) Removing, trimming or tampering with scurs, or any animal that is not a naturally polled animal.
 - (2) Cutting out, dyeing or otherwise tampering with any white hairs, constituting what is known as a lineback on the back of any animal.
 - (3) Application of hair or artificial foundation in any area of the animal to alter the appearance of the natural lines of structure of the animal.
 - (4) Application of dye or coloring to hair of any animal in any area of its body that would change natural color or color marking/pattern of animal.
- J. **SIFTING:** All cattle entered for show may be inspected and required to meet minimum standards of type, quality and conformation.
- K. **BEST SIX HEAD:** Exhibitors who make entries in the Best Six Head Class are required to lead out in this class, or forfeit their premium money, providing they have at least six animals in the event.
- L. **SENIOR YEARLING HEIFERS:** In shows after January 1, senior yearling age heifers (calved Sept. 1-Dec. 31) are required to be exhibited in show ring competition with their own natural calf (not embryo transplant) at foot.
- M. **CALVES SHOWN WITH DAMS:** A calf exhibited in show ring competition with its dam, in any class, is eligible to compete in an individual calf class by itself in the same show, and vice versa.

PREMIER BREEDER and PREMIER EXHIBITOR

Points given on eight head only.

Awarded with the following point system – 1st place = 5 points, 2nd place = 4 points, 3rd place = 3 points, 4th place = 2 points and 5th place = 1 point. No points will be given for champions. Points will be awarded for the Get of Sire and Best Six Head for Premier Exhibitor and Get of Sire for Premier Breeder. The same scoring system as above will be used for awarding points for the group classes.

It is suggested that banner be given to the Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder.

Tie Breaker: Exhibitor with the most points won by animals bred AND OWNED IN INDIVIDUAL CLASSES.

STANDARD RULES & REGULATIONS

for the Exhibition of Limousin Cattle - Level III

Show Date – September 1, 2009 – 1:30 p.m.

1. All animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation. Any animal over 30 days of age, including calves to be shown at side of dam, must have proof of a registration certificate and be recorded with the North American Limousin Foundation. For ET calves, parentage verification paperwork must be in the NALF system.
2. **(New for 2009)** Animals must be 75% Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual) or greater as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates or purple-papered Lim-Flex® cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates. Percentage, fullblood, purebred and Lim-Flex cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships.
3. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must properly match the registration certificate. If an animal's tattoo is not legible and cannot be read the first time through processing, it will not be allowed to come back through with a fresh tattoo. Fresh tattoos are acceptable but animals that do not have a legible tattoo the first time will not be run back through the processing procedure, the animal not having a legible tattoo will not be allowed to participate in the show (Amended 1/01).
4. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, the North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner.

Unethical fitting shall include the following:

- a) Any use of paints, hair coloring conditioners, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or any other substances; all animals subject to white towel test (amended 8/01).
- b) The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tailheads and false polls(false tail switches are allowed);
- c) The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal;
- d) The injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation;
- e) Any attempts to disrupt or change the normal dental development of the animal;
- f) Any products/solutions /liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth promotants, and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method per os (by esophagus).

EXCEPTIONS: In the case of severely sick or severely dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent and/or North American Limousin Foundation representative. This exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.

5. All bulls over one year must show with a nose-lead. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the Limousin show superintendent and the show management.
6. All protests against exhibitors or individual animals or fitting violations dealing with the age or genetic background of show cattle must be submitted in writing and signed by five (5) lifetime members of the North American Limousin Foundation and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours after the completion of the show.
7. The North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development at any show sponsored by the Foundation.
8. The North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal.
9. Classes and championship breaks will be made up after all cattle have been checked in. No class shall contain more than 20 head or have an age spread of more than 60 days unless the animals are over two years old. Premiums will be awarded on a graduated basis among the animals in the classes after the show has been completed.
10. **Calves exhibited alongside dams in the cow/calf class are ineligible to show as individuals. In addition, all calves exhibited alongside dams must be registered. (Amended 1/01)**
11. All cattle will be processed before the show.
12. In shows occurring after January 1, 2009 calves born through August 31, 2009 are eligible to show.
13. *All animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, except birth marks. (Amended 1/03).*

LEVEL III Medal of Excellence Events

Performance Requirements:

In order to maintain a high degree of integrity and credibility in all Limousin shows, all owners and exhibitors will be expected to adhere to all North American Limousin Foundation rules and regulations regarding the exhibition of Limousin cattle. STANDARD SHOW CLASSIFICATION & SHOW REGULATIONS

1. Registered Red Angus Cattle, including Category I-A (100%) and Category I-B (87% through 99%) will be eligible to show. The decision to show Category I-A and Category I-B together in the classes shall be left to the individual states, with respect to state fairs, and such shows that come under state supervision. All shows under Red Angus Association sponsorship will be conducted under a joint show provision wherein Category I-A and Category I-B show together in the same classes.

2. All animals entered must conform to all show and Association eligibility requirements.
3. Cattle entered in any Red Angus show must be officially registered in the appropriate Red Angus Association Herdbook. Exhibitors are subject to all rules, regulations and policies of the Red Angus Association of America.
4. Entries in classes at any Red Angus show are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the Red Angus Association with reference to inspection of entries, such as blood typing, mouthing and such other inspections prescribed by the Red Angus Association of America.
5. Any animal entered in a Red Angus show found to have an illegible tattoo, improper or incorrect tattoo or no tattoo, or dental development in excess of allowable limits, will be disqualified for that and subsequent Red Angus shows. Reinstatement of animals thus disqualified can be authorized only by the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Red Angus Association of America.
6. Each exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus cattle entered in any Red Angus show or exhibition is required to insure that each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting, grooming and treatment of hooves.(a)Unacceptable modification, alteration, grooming, fitting or treatment of hooves will subject the individual animal to disqualification in the show.

OWNERSHIP

1. Each entry in a Red Angus show must be made in the name of the owner of record, or a member of the intermediate family of the family of record, appearing on the Registration Certificate.
2. Partnership animals must be so registered and entered under the partnership designation.
3. Exhibitors must have official Registration Certificates on all entries available for inspection by show and/or Association officials. This may include officially produced copies of original Registration Certificates obtainable at no charge from the Red Angus Association National Office.
4. Animals entered in any Red Angus show for which application for registry has "been applied for" must have a Letter of Eligibility from the Red Angus Association National Office, that such papers are in process. In the case of calves too young to register, the letter will state that the animal is "eligible for registration."
5. Animals entered in any Red Angus show must have been registered in the name of the person entering said animal(s) not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of judging.
6. Substitutions for animals already entered in a Red Angus show will be permitted up to and including seven (7) days previous to the announced date of judging, providing such substitution(s) is/are permitted by the show management.

These funds will be used to purchase awards presented to winners in the show, and the balance (if any) will be disbursed as follows: The winner of the New York Special will receive 15% (to be split 10% for 1st and 5% for 2nd if there are at least 7 entries); Grand Champions 10%, Reserve Grand Champions 5% and Divisional Champions will receive the balance divided equally.

The Simmental classes are open to all duly REGISTERED animals of the American Simmental Association or the Canadian Simmental Association. All females & males must have an official original registration certificate.

All females entered in class 320 are required to have a certificate from a licensed veterinarian stating that the female is safe in calf prior to show date or have a letter from an embryo transplant facility stating that she has produced viable embryos prior to show date or have a natural calf at side.

All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the American Simmental Association or Canadian Simmental Association as evidenced by the ORIGINAL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE. Jointly owned animals must be entered and shown under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in individual classes, and for the purposes of calculating Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder, the points are attributable to the multi-ownership (all co-owners) not to the individual co-owners.

In the group classes, jointly owned animals may be entered and exhibited under the name of one of the co-owners provided he owns a full or part interest in each of the animals in the group entry. Individual animals shown in all group classes listed below, except the Cow-Calf Class, must have been entered and shown in one of the following classes for individual animals. For group classes, except the Get-of-Sire Class and Produce of Dam, all individual animals making up a group entry must be owned or co-owned by the exhibitor. There is no ownership requirement for Get-of-Sire Class or Produce of Dam Class. The Get-of-Sire Class shall be in the name of the sire, not the exhibitor(s). Family members' animals registered in a Junior member's name and entered in the open show may be treated as family entries in the group classes, as long as the Junior member is 21 years of age and under as of January 1st of that year. For the purpose of Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor points, an exhibitor will be considered a Junior member and their family as one, as explained above.

Two-year-old Cow/Calf and Aged Cow/Calf classes must have natural suckling calf at side. Calf must be born on or after January 1, 2009 through June 30, 2009. Calf can be shown individually. Any age cow in the aged cow/calf classes.

A Premier Exhibitor Banner will be awarded to the exhibitor accumulating the most points on animals (not to exceed 10 head) exhibited by him and shown in individual classes.

A Premier Breeder Banner will be awarded to the breeder accumulating the most points on animals bred by him and shown in the individual classes. Points for Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder shall be calculated as follows: One point shall be given for each animal an individual placed above up to a maximum of 9 points to 1st place, 8 points to 2nd place and 7 points to 3rd place. (For example, a first place winner in a class of six animals shall receive five points.) Points shall be awarded only to the first three places in the class. Grand Champion shall receive 5 points; Reserve Grand Champion, 4 points; Division Champions, 3 points; and Reserve Divisional Champions, 2 points. In the event of a tie, the number of points shall be divided by the number of animals the points were derived from and the exhibitor/breeder having the higher point average shall be presented the award.

**HERDSMEN PRIZE DIVISION
(No entry fee in this Division)**

The State Fair personnel and the Breed Representatives have agreed on a new set of rules for our herdsman award. The award for these people will be on display in the office. An award will be given for each session. If time allows, points will be posted each day. Points will be listed following each rule for a total of 100 points. Each exhibitor must have at least four animals exhibited to be eligible to compete.

Each exhibit will be judged on daily appearance of exhibit and personnel; availability of personnel with herds to furnish information about their exhibit; and interest of personnel in cooperating with show officials in making the best possible presentation.

SCORE CARD FOR DETERMINING BASIS OF AWARDS

- A. Cooperative effort means -35 points
 - 1. In the Barn 8:00 a.m.
 - 2. Cooperate with barn management
 - 3. Courteous to fellow exhibitors and the public
 - 4. Neat appearance.

- B. Animals.....25 points
 - 1. Animals tied for best effect.
 - 2. Properly fed and watered.
 - 3. Clean bark bedding

- C. Pens or Stall Areas.....40 points
 - 1. Stalls or pens kept clean
 - 2. Aisles clean.
 - 2. Stall cards with names.
 - 3. Equipment and feed properly taken care of.

- TOTAL 100 points**

No straw bedding allowed in the barn area, only the bark bedding. **No** straw or other bedding allowed in tie out area.

Tear down time will be 5:00 p.m. unless designated by the office.

Prizes will be awarded at 4:00 p.m.

Early release eliminates the exhibitor from awards. Breed exceptions as requested.

A **SPECIAL AWARD** for the BEST herdsman in each breed will be awarded, providing a minimum of 25 head of that breed have been shown that year. If that minimum is not attained, the BEST herdsman of that breed will instead receive a cash prize (\$25.00) and rosette.
